### Great Blue Heron: King of the Wading Birds! Vocabulary Words

Adaptable- being able to adjust to new conditions or surroundings.

Beak- the pointy part of a bird's jaw.

Clutch- the total number of eggs laid in one nesting attempt.

Colonies- a large congregation of individuals of one or more species nesting in a particular location.

Heron- a type of wading bird characterized by its long legs that hunts and feeds in shallow water.

Heronries- a breeding colony of herons.

Juvenile- the immature stage of a great blue heron. Larger than a chick but not quite an adult.

Opportunistic- taking advantage of certain opportunities as they arise.

Sustain- to support physically.

Thriving- doing well in terms of population numbers.

Wading Bird- a water bird typically with long legs that wades in the water.




